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Kinetic Letters

If you have children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, you have probably heard a lot about our new approach to teaching handwriting – I know I've had a couple of questions about lizard poses and special pencils! Kinetic Letters is a research-driven approach to the teaching of handwriting that concentrates initially on the physicality of how to write and addresses some of the issues that children can face when starting to learn to hold a pencil and develop writing stamina. Much of the early part of the programme focuses on developing key areas of physical strength and you may hear your children talking about practising things like gorilla and penguin poses! All our children in EYFS and KS1 are now following the Kinetic Letters programme and we will be rolling it out across the rest of the school over coming months with the remainder of our staff all trained by September. We will run information sessions once the whole school is doing the scheme as part of our update work at the beginning of next year. In the meantime, please do speak to staff if you have any questions.
